

The First Reading Acts 1:15-17, 21-26

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, "Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus—for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry. So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." Jesus prayed for his disciples, "I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. #### The Nicene Creed





#### Then, facing the Holy Table, the Celebrant proceeds

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. #### The people stand or kneel. Then the Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

#### Musical Notes

Falling as it does between Ascension Day (last Thursday) and the Feast of Pentecost (next Sunday), the Seventh Sunday of Easter has a distinctive if transitional character in the church's liturgical year. In part, it looks back, with a Collect very much rooted in Ascension-thinking; the readings, rather, seem to look forward to what is to come with the Descent of the Spirit and the carrying forth of the Messiah's teaching and fellowship.

Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958) was one of the greatest musical figures of his generation in England. Though professedly agnostic, he contributed enormously to the music of the Church in the twentieth century, both through a lifetime of composition for choirs, and through his musical editorship of one of the great monuments of English hymnody, *The English Hymnal*, first published in 1906. He was also a dedicated collector and preserver of folk-songs, making field-research a frequent pastime and preserving for future generations (and for his own compositional use) traditional music from various corners of rural England.


