MUSICAL NOTES

We gratefully welcome trumpeter Rick Murrell this morning.



This afternoon at 5 p.m. we gather for the annual Requiem commemorating all the faithful departed. The choral music for the service is *Requiem in D minor* by Gabriel Fauré, a piece of great beauty and serenity; a chamber orchestra joins the choir in presenting it. The service includes the reading of the Necrology and Holy Communion, with the Rev. Leslie Reimer preaching, and a reception follows. Please join us!



The music at the Offertory, by the Victorian composer Charles Villiers Stanford, is from a set of three Latin-texted motets which he composed for the choir of Trinity College, where he had long been the Organist and musical director. The text is one often associated with All Saints' and All Souls' Days.



The music by Joseph Jongen, heard as the Necrology is read at Communion, comes from a substantial collection of music by numerous composers memorializing the lives lost in World War I. It takes its inspiration from a line in the Requiem liturgy, sometimes translated as: *Think, good Jesus: my salvation/cost thy wondrous incarnation;/ leave me not to reprobation!*

Using a Donor Advised Fund at Calvary

In recent years, donor advised funds have become an increasingly popular way for individuals and families to structure their charitable contributions. One IRS regulation about donor advised funds is that the donor is not able to sign a legally enforceable pledge letter because, technically, the funds are no longer theirs to give away, but rather are held by the funding entity or sponsor. This is often a community foundation or a financial firm.

However, it is possible to be a part of Calvary's annual stewardship campaign using a donor advised fund. The following language is acceptable to the IRS and can be included with your notification to Calvary about your intention to support the church in 2020:

"I/We intend to recommend a grant from the [name of donor-advised fund], a donor-advised fund, in the amount of \$X during the year 2020. Grant recommendations are subject to the approval of [name of fund sponsor/entity]. This expression of intent does not create a legally enforceable obligation." A Reading from the Book of Daniel [7:1-3, 15-18]

In the first year of King Belshazzar of Babylon, Daniel had a dream and visions of his head as he lay in bed. Then he wrote down the dream: I, Daniel, saw in my vision by night the four winds of heaven stirring up the great sea, and four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another. As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my head terrified me. I approached one of the attendants to ask him the truth concerning all this. So he said that he would disclose to me the interpretation of the matter: "As for these four great beasts, four kings shall arise out of the earth. But the holy ones of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom forever — forever and ever."

Reader: The Word of the LORD. Congregation: Thanks be to God.

A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Ephesians [1:11-23]

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory. I have heard of your faith in the LORD Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our LORD Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Reader: The Word of the LORD. Congregation: Thanks be to God.

The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to Luke [6:20-31]

Response before the Gospel: Glory to you, LORD Christ.

Jesus looked up at his disciples and said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets. But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets. But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to others as you would have them do to you."
